## Two Wheel Trauma (TWT)

The Two Wheel Trauma concept was fashioned in early 1986 by three experienced EMS providers in rural Spencer, Iowa. Anita Bailey, Slider Gilmore and Frank Prowant saw the need for a specialized EMS program designed to save lives. The purpose of the Two Wheel Trauma seminar is to reduce the morbidity and mortality of motorcycle crashes through prevention and education.



At the conclusion of the TWT program each participant shall be able to:

- identify motorcycle parts; including the associated hazards and injury potential
- explain two principles for crowd management
- identify treatment modalities for environmental hazards including hypothermia and burn injuries
- identify and manage traumatic, life-threatening injuries
- list the steps for assessment and treatment of all types of injuries
- list the steps to immobilize the entire body from standing and supine positions
- list when and how to remove a helmet

**Two Wheel Trauma is a six hour continuing education course intended for EMS, nursing, fire and law enforcement personnel**

## Share The Road (STR)

The STR program goal is to reduce motorcycle crashes by educating motor vehicle drivers to safely interact with motorcycles on the roadways. Wayne Wierson presents STR at every Two Wheel Trauma conference. In addition, Share The Road may be scheduled as a course on its own through its partnership with ABATE of Iowa.

At the conclusion of the STR program each participant shall be able to:

- list types of motorcycles and protective gear
- explain the pleasurable aspects of motorcycling and dispel common stereotypes
- list three scenarios to describe how the motorcyclist uses lane position to enhance safety
- list common places where crashes occur due to difficult visibility or inattentive motor vehicle drivers

## Accident Scene Management (ASM)

**Presented by: Slider Gilmore**



Experience as an EMT taught Slider how quality first aid helps the injured even before EMS arrives. Witnessing the benefit of good care and the tragedy of poor care inspired Slider to develop Accident Scene Management in 1989. The goal of ASM is to teach motorcyclists roadside emergency trauma skills to care for the injured rider. Through education the death and disability associated with motorcycle trauma is greatly reduced.

At the conclusion of the ASM program each participant shall be able to:

- identify common scene stressors and list techniques to help maintain composure
- list methods to ensure personal safety
- explain how to call and assist EMS
- list initial life-saving actions to maintain the ABC's and minimize further injury
